It is irrefutable that California and the entire nation not only depend upon, but flourish from the contributions of people of color and immigrants to our culture, our society, and our economy. The same people lying about the contributions of undocumented immigrants (who pay \$8.5 billion to California in taxes per year in California alone, aside from their multitudinous other contributions) are the same ones enriching themselves by exploiting precarious citizenship status and by detaining people in for-profit detention centers. This status quo cannot be permitted to endure.

This administration has chosen to escalate its terror on communities, systematically sweeping through our cities with contempt for state sovereignty and individual rights. After decades of docility in the face of growing oligarchic power, excessive use of force, racial profiling, internet surveillance, harassment, and dehumanization of our neighbors, it is high time we address the poisonous roots that produce the horrors we see today.
