Julius is a graduate of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Law School, and received his undergraduate degree at Davidson College. Before entering law school, he was awarded a Rockefeller Fellowship in theological studies and received a Master's degree in theology from the Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley.

Julius has practiced workers' compensation and social security disability law since 1979, and is recognized as the "go to" person for current issues and developments in the field. An excellent trial attorney and negotiator, he has represented thousands of individuals who have sustained life-changing injuries or illnesses on the job.

He is also the founder, writer, and editor of www.workerscompzone.com, a LexisNexis award-winning blog. In addition, Julius and his colleague Richard Jacobsmeyer produced a video series, "The Comp Guys," that features discussion and analytical commentary on significant issues and developments in the workers' compensation fields.

Julius has served injured workers and their families as well as the advocates and agencies that rely on his expertise, in many arenas. He was appointed to the Executive Committee of the California State Bar's Workers' Compensation Law Section from 2007 to 2010, and as a Judge Pro Tem at the Workers Compensation Appeals Board (WCAB) since 2005.
