Hotel Housekeeper Injury Prevention Campaign

Worksafe is honored to recognize UNITE HERE for their successful campaign addressing musculoskeletal injuries among hotel housekeepers. With the support of UNITE HERE international, seven UNITE HERE affiliated locals across California were at the center of this campaign:

- Local 49 - Sacramento
- Local 2 - San Francisco
- Local 2850 - Oakland
- Local 483 - Monterey
- Local 19 - San Jose
- Local 30 - San Diego
- Local 11 - LA, Orange County and Arizona

There are approximately 99,000 hotel housekeepers in California, and the majority are women, immigrants, and people of color. These workers face serious ergonomic hazards and suffer high rates of preventable injuries, especially strains, sprains, and tears.

UNITE HERE first petitioned Cal/OSHA for a musculoskeletal injury prevention standard in 2012. Hotel workers were at the forefront of the effort from the beginning. Nearly 300 union member housekeepers participated in public meetings to convince state officials of the need for stronger protections.

Workers testified about the hazards they experience at work: repeatedly lift 100-pound mattresses, push massive utility carts over miles of thick carpet, and work in painful positions due to the lack of appropriate adjustable cleaning tools. They explained how unreasonable time demands and understaffed hotels made this work even less safe.

La Campaña de Prevención de Lesiones para las Recamareras de Hotel

Worksafe se enorgullece de reconocer a UNITE HERE por su exitosa campaña que aborda las lesiones musculoesqueléticas entre las recamareras de limpieza de hotel. Con el apoyo de UNITE HERE internacional, siete locales afiliados a UNITE HERE a través de California estuvieron al centro de esta campaña:

- Local 49 - Sacramento
- Local 2 - San Francisco
- Local 2850 - Oakland
- Local 483 - Monterey
- Local 19 - San Jose
- Local 30, San Diego
- Local 11 - LA, El Condado de Orange y Arizona

Hay aproximadamente 99,000 recamareras de hoteles en California, y la mayoría son mujeres, inmigrantes y personas de color. Estos trabajadores enfrentan serios peligros ergonómicos y sufren altas tasas de lesiones prevenibles, especialmente tensión, torceduras y desgarres.

UNITE HERE le solicitó por primera vez a Cal/OSHA un estándar de prevención de lesiones musculoesqueléticas en 2012. Los trabajadores de hotel estuvieron a la vanguardia del esfuerzo desde el principio. Cerca de 300 recamareras, miembros del sindicato participaron en reuniones públicas para convencer a los oficiales de estado de la necesidad de protecciones más fuertes.

Los trabajadores declararon sobre los peligros que sufren en el trabajo: levante repetidamente de colchones de 100 libras, empuje de carros de servicio masivos sobre millas de alfombra gruesa y trabajar en posiciones dolorosas debido a la falta de herramientas de limpieza ajustables apropiadas. Explicaron que las exigencias de tiempo poco razonables y hoteles con falta de personal hacen que este trabajo sea aún menos seguro.



In March 2018, after six years of dedicated effort, the campaign finally succeeded in California's Office of Administrative Law approved the Hotel Housekeeping Musculoskeletal Injury Prevention standard. As a result, employers must establish a musculoskeletal injury prevention program, and housekeepers and their union representatives will be involved in several steps of the plan to reduce hazards.

"Many times our work is not recognized, and we who do this work are under-appreciated," said Ana Maria Rodriguez, 46, a housekeeper in Anaheim. "With this vote, our work has more importance and we have a way to protect ourselves."

UNITE HERE's dedication and commitment of resources and leadership, along with the active and determined participation of many courageous housekeepers, brought this victory home. On behalf of your friends at Worksafe, we thank you for speaking out on this issue and for your commitment to justice for hotel workers.

En marzo de 2018, después de seis años de esfuerzos dedicados, la campaña finalmente tuvo éxito con la Oficina de Leyes Administrativas de California, que aprobó el estándar de Prevención de Lesiones Musculo-esqueléticas de Mantenimiento de Hotel. Como resultado, los empleadores deben establecer un programa de prevención de lesiones musculo-esqueléticas, y las recamareras y sus representantes de sindicato participarán en varios pasos del plan para reducir los peligros.

"Muchas veces nuestro trabajo no es reconocido, y nosotros que hacemos este trabajo somos subvalorados", dijo Ana María Rodríguez, de 46 años, una recamarera en Anaheim. "Con este voto, nuestro trabajo tiene más importancia y tenemos una manera de protegernos".

La dedicación y el compromiso de recursos y el liderazgo de UNITE HERE, junto con la participación decidida de muchas recamareras valientes, trajeron esta victoria a casa. De parte de sus amigos en Worksafe, les agradecemos por haber alzado su voz sobre este tema y por su compromiso a la justicia para los trabajadores de los hoteles.

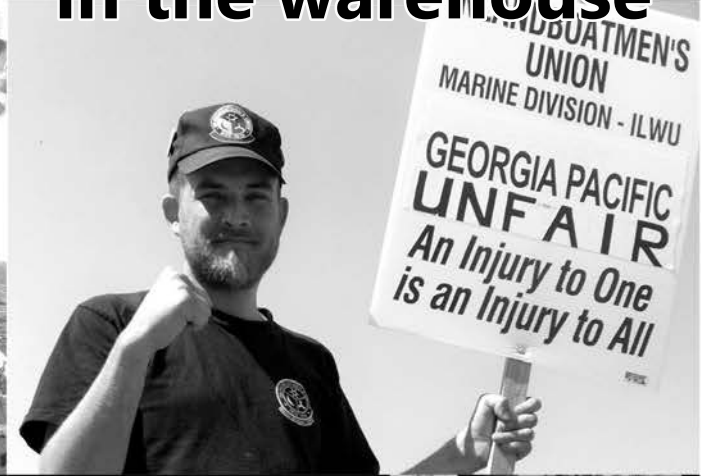

BRENDA ESKENAZI, PHD



Worksafe is thrilled to honor Brenda Eskenazi, PhD for her tremendous contributions to occupational health and safety in California. Dr. Eskenazi directs the Center for Environmental Research and Children's Health (CERCH) at UC Berkeley, and has for decades led groundbreaking epidemiological research on the negative effects of pesticides and other environmental toxins on maternal and child health, particularly in low-income and immigrant worker communities.

Dr. Eskenazi is currently the Principal Investigator and Director of the Center for the Health Assessment of Mothers and Children of Salinas (CHAMACOS), a program she helped start in the late 1990s to investigate health effects of pesticides and other toxins in farmworkers and their children and to develop interventions to prevent future exposure.

Since its inception, CHAMACOS has collected over 350,000 biological and environmental samples and has published more than 150 papers on the health effects of environmental toxins on children. CHAMACOS has studied pesticides, flame retardants, and plasticizers in relation to

Worksafe se complace en honrar a Brenda Eskenazi, PhD por sus tremendas contribuciones a la salud y seguridad ocupacional en California. La Dra. Eskenazi dirige el Centro de Investigación Ambiental y Salud Infantil (CERCH, por sus siglas en inglés) en la Universidad de California en Berkeley, y durante décadas ha liderado investigaciones epidemiológicas innovadoras sobre los efectos negativos de los pesticidas y otras toxinas ambientales en la salud materna e infantil, particularmente en comunidades de personas trabajadoras de bajos ingresos e inmigrantes.

La Dra. Eskenazi es actualmente la Investigadora Principal y Directora del Centro para la Evaluación de la Salud de Madres e Hijos de Salinas (CHAMACOS, por sus siglas en inglés), un programa que ella ayudó a iniciar a fines de la década de 1990 para investigar los efectos de los pesticidas y otras toxinas en la salud de los trabajadores agrícolas y sus hijos y desarrollar intervenciones para prevenir futuras exposiciones.

Desde su inicio, CHAMACOS ha recolectado más de 350,000 muestras biológicas y

fetal and child growth, neurodevelopment, asthma-related symptoms, and puberty. In addition to research, CHAMACOS has a very active community outreach and translation program involving growers, farmworkers, advocates, medical personnel, and local youth.

Dr. Eskenazi's work has had enormous impact in the fight to protect workers and their families from the environmental toxins present in too many workplaces and communities. The CHAMACOS research has changed perceptions of toxicant risks and comprised a body of research that helped spur the EPA in 2016 to propose banning the organophosphate pesticide chlorpyrifos — a proposal that was rescinded by the Trump administration but has gained ground in California.

In addition to her work with CHAMACOS, Dr. Eskenazi advises the World Health Organization on children's environmental health issues. She is a member of the National Advisory Environmental Health Science Council for the National Institutes of Health, is on the scientific advisory boards of Healthy Children, Healthy World and the Children's Environmental Health Coalition, and has sat on the Board of Children, Youth and Families for the National Academy of Science.

Dr. Eskenazi currently serves as the Jennifer and Brian Maxwell Professor of Maternal and Child Health and Epidemiology at the School of Public Health at UC Berkeley and has over 400 publications to her name.

ambientales y ha publicado más de 150 artículos sobre los efectos en la salud de las toxinas ambientales en los niños. CHAMACOS ha estudiado pesticidas, productos ignífugos y plastificantes en relación con el crecimiento fetal e infantil, el desarrollo neurológico, los síntomas relacionados con el asma y la pubertad. Además de la investigación, CHAMACOS tiene un programa comunitario muy activo de desenvolvimiento y traducción que incluye a agricultores, trabajadores agrícolas, defensores, personal médico y jóvenes locales.

El trabajo de la Dra. Eskenazi ha tenido un enorme impacto en la lucha para proteger a los trabajadores y sus familias de las toxinas ambientales presentes en demasiados lugares de trabajo y comunidades. Las investigaciones de CHAMACOS han cambiado las percepciones de los riesgos tóxicos y ha compuesto una investigación que ayudó a estimular a la EPA en el 2016 a proponer la prohibición del pesticida organofosforado clorofirifo, una propuesta que desafortunadamente se frustró bajo la administración de Trump.

Además de su trabajo con CHAMACOS, la Dra. Eskenazi asesora a la Organización Mundial de la Salud en temas de salud ambiental infantil. Ella es miembro del Consejo Consultivo Nacional de Ciencias de la Salud Ambiental de los Institutos Nacionales de la Salud, forma parte de los consejos científicos de Niños Sanos, Mundo Sano y de la Coalición de Salud Ambiental de los Niños, y ha formado parte de la Junta de Niños, Jóvenes y Familias para la Academia Nacional de Ciencias.

La Dra. Eskenazi actualmente se desempeña como Profesora de Salud Materna e Infantil y Epidemiología de Jennifer y Brian Maxwell en la Escuela de Salud Pública de la Universidad de California Berkeley y tiene más de 400 publicaciones a su nombre.

DEEG GOLD, MPH, CIH



Deborah Gold, known to many as Deeg, is well-known for their educational, technical, and scientific expertise in occupational health and safety. Deeg's entire career, with Cal/OSHA and beyond, demonstrates their fierce commitment to worker health and safety.

Deeg received a BA from Antioch College in 1972 and worked in the trades for almost twenty years before returning to school to earn a Master of Public Health degree from UC Berkeley in 1993, and later becoming a Certified Industrial Hygienist. Before attending UC, Deeg was the health and safety rep for the San Francisco Local of the American Postal Workers Union.

After school Deeg's first professional job was at UC Berkeley's Labor Occupational Health Program as a staff research associate. In October 1993, they joined Cal/OSHA where they conducted field compliance inspections for seven years in a wide variety of industrial, commercial, university, healthcare, and public sector workplaces. They then worked as a Senior Industrial Hygienist in Cal/OSHA's Research and Standards Unit for an additional 11 years, developing health-related regulations on bloodborne pathogens, aerosol transmissible diseases, and indoor

Después de la escuela, el primer trabajo profesional de Deeg fue en el Programa de Salud Ocupacional de la Universidad de Berkeley, como investigador asociado. En octubre de 1993, se unió a Cal/OSHA en donde realizó inspecciones de cumplimiento de campo durante siete años en una amplia variedad de lugares de trabajo industriales, comerciales, universitarios, de cuidado de salud y del sector público. Luego trabajó como

air quality. Deeg also coordinated projects involving emergency response, isocyanates, and hazardous wastes.

In 2011, Deeg was promoted to serve as the Deputy Chief at Cal/OSHA. Deeg's tenure in this role was one of the most productive periods of rulemaking in agency history. It was marked by a high level of professionalism and collaboration with all stakeholders resulting in effective, comprehensive regulatory standards to protect California's 19 million workers.

Under Deeg's leadership from 2011 through 2014, Cal/OSHA developed groundbreaking standards to protect workers from patient handling ergonomics hazards and exposures to hazardous chemicals. During this time they also began work on the workplace violence in healthcare and hotel housekeeping standards. These regulations were adopted by the state of California and have set the bar nationally.

Since retiring in January 2015, Deeg has continued to provide consultation, training, and educational materials for California state agencies, the University of California, unions, and other community organizations — including Worksafe. They have received multiple awards for their outstanding leadership and commitment to the cause of worker health and safety.

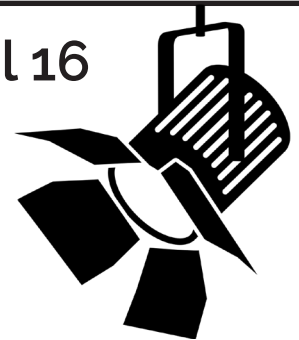

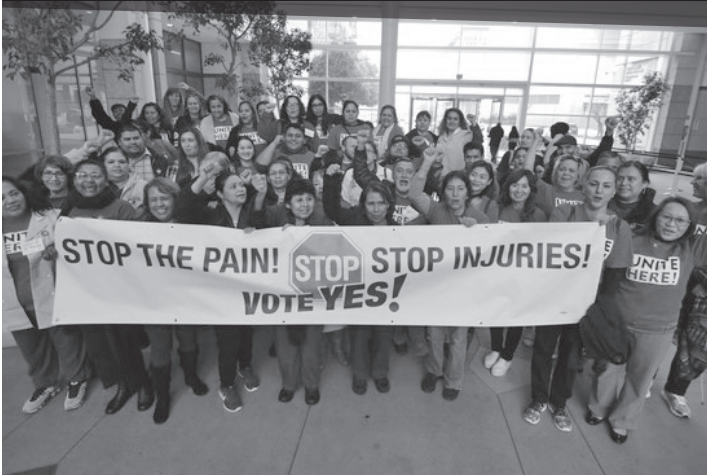
